Program Accomplishments

Transitional Housing:

Partnered with Grace Hill to provide 7 transitional, scattered-site apartments for larger families. All families are provided case management to ensure success in education, employment and finances. During 2012, 51 people were served in our transitional housing program, including 41 children.

The 180 Way:

Created innovative curriculum designed bec to identify the obstacles our families were facing. Through educational, interactive exercises and group discussions adults become empowered and inspired to move beyond homelessness and make a "180" in their lives.

Preserving Hope

Our agency has been serving women, children and families experiencing homelessness for more than 35 years. Rather than "managing" the homeless population, Gateway180 works with outstanding partners to provide families with basic needs, case management, health services and access to critical resources to develop life skills. The path from homeless to "home again" can be overwhelming and confusing. But with hard work, support from their case manager and community resources, every Gateway180 family can achieve permanent housing.

Providing Heart

Our vision is to end family homelessness in the St. Louis community. We do this through compassion, pragmatism, dignity, respect, empowerment, choice, partnership and accountability. This is possible thanks to partnerships with a strong network of agencies, public funders and the generosity of St. Louis donors and volunteers.

Returning Home

Of the 1,500 typically served each year in our emergency shelter, approximately 30% of these individuals will successfully complete the program and are placed into supportive housing. Success is measured in a variety of ways: daughters who get full scholarships to Columbia University and 9-year old boys who are encouraged to become writers. In addition to great success stories, we monitor achievements throughout the program to measure such things as acquiring and maintaining employment, remaining in the same living space and effectively managing their expenses.

Our *Mission*

Gateway 180 is a valuable resource for women and children experiencing the unimaginable burden of homelessness. We provide safe, nurturing emergency shelter services designed to get women, children and families into transitional or permanent homes in less than 30 days.
